The Real Meaning of Wealth

What does the word "wealth" mean to you? The answer to this may be different for each individual because we have different personalities. What she really wanted was freedom so she finally experienced non-material wealth. This movie made me think about "What is the real wealth for me". I live in Japan where I can live a materially happy life. But I realized what is the most important for me. That is, to have room in my heart. If you have room in your heart, you can find the pleasure of seeing a beautiful clear sky in the day time and beautiful stars at night. Also you can appreciate tiny things which you don't usually notice. These make your life very content.

Now in Japan I sometimes think, we are surrounded with so much material wealth, but not so much spiritual wealth. For example, you know, we have a lot of problems which come from the lack of spiritual wealth such as depression, overworking, suicide, bullying and so on. Especially, suicide and bullying have a close relationship. It's sad to say, that more and more junior high school students put an end to their lives because of bullying. I believe this shows that both bullies and bullied children don't have spiritual wealth. So I suggest that we should give moral education to students. My feeling is that moral education is not considered very important in school education. If
